

History of Clarksburg

"an old community with new ideas"

Clarksburg, Maryland was first settled in 1752 by William Clarke, who came here from Lancaster, PA to trade with the Seneca Indians. His son, John, built his house at 23346 Frederick Road (Rt. 355).

For many years, Dowden's Ordinary, a tavern in Clarksburg, was the midway stop by stagecoach between Frederick City and the thriving port of Georgetown.

In the mid 1800's, Clarksburg had General Stores, Tanneries, Leather-making Machines, Blacksmiths, and Wheelwright Shops.

Among early travelers, was Andrew Jackson, who dined in Dowden's Ordinary on his way to Washington, DC.

British General Edward Braddock also traveled through Clarksburg on his way to Fort Duquesne near Pittsburgh, PA.

Historic Sites

- 1. Day House, 23200 Stringtown Road, an American Foursquare Frame house with a wrap-around porch. Believed to be built in 1925.
- 2. Hammer Hill, 23310 Frederick Road, a three-story Queen Anne built about 1891 by Clarksburg physician James Deets and his wife. The name may have come from the hammering sounds from a blacksmith working atop the hill on the property, owner Gary Poole says.
- # 3. Columbus Woodward/John Wims Hosse, 23311 Frederick Road. A two-story frame building with a gable roof. Built in two stages—rear portion in the early 19th century, the remainder in 1892.
- 4. Clarisburg Grocery, 23329 Frederick Road, a one-story, early 20th century store.


- 5. Gardner/Miles House, 23330 Frederick Road, early 20th century frame house with wrap-around porch.
- a 6. Clarkuburg School, 13530 Redgrave Place, a 1½ story frame two-room school house, opened in 1909. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places and the county's historic master plan.
- a 7. Horace Wilson House, 23335 Frederick Road, 1½ story frame dwelling with two dormers. Original portion built about 1800 by John Reid, then sold to Horace Wilson, a physician and former state delegate and senator, who built the large front section between 1827 and 1843.
- 8. Leonidas Wilson House, 23340 Frederick Road, a two-story house with Italianate detail built starting in the early 19th century. The main portion was built in the 1840s by Clarksburg merchant William Wilson who operated the town's general store. The Boxwood Inn, a boarding house, was operated there in the 1920s.
- 9. Wilson's Store, 23341 Frederick Road, a 2½ story frame store constructed two sections in 1842 and sometime after 1860. Built on the site of the town's first trading post, established by town founder John Clark.
- m 10. Old Parsonage, 23345 Frederick Road, Italianate residence, built about 1815 and used as a church parsonage until 1915.
- 11. Clark/Waters House, 23346 Frederick Road, a 2½-story Italianate frame residence. Town founder John Clark probably built the original section of logs in 1797.
- 12. Elizabeth Powers House, 23360 Frederick Road, a 2½-story dwelling built in two stages—the rear portion by Henry Burnsides in 1820, the rest by Issac and Elizabeth Powers in 1840. Powers was the town Postmistress.
- 13. John Gibson House, 23362 Frederick Road, a two-story frame house with some of the most elaborate architectural details in Clarksburg.
- III. Clarksburg Methodist Episcopal Church, 23425 Spire Street, a Gothic Revival church that is now the United Methodist Church. A log chapel was built on the site in 1794, a brick structure in 1853 and the present wood church in 1909. The congregation descends from one organized by town founder John Clark and others.
- I.S. W.J. Dronenburg House, 23401 Frederick Road, a 2½-story brick residence. About 1865 by William Dronnenburg, the town's leading blacksmith.
- 16. Methodist Episcopal Church personage, 23407 Frederick Road, a good example of American Foursquare architecture, built in 1914 by trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church.
- 17. John Leeman House, 23415 Frederick Road, one of the few remaining buildings in the community, associated with Thomas Kirk who built the house in 1801.
- a 18. William Hurley House and Shoe Shop, 23421 Frederick Road, a 1½ story frame house with original portion built about 1800. It housed Helen Hurley's Mullinery shop in the early 20th century. The shoe shop was built about 1842.

- a 19. Lewis/Soper House, 23421 Frederick Road, a 1½-story frame house built about 1890.
- a 20. Dowden's Ordinary Marker, This land was part of Hammer Hill consisting of 40 acres, was patented to Michael A. Dowden on November 10, 1752.

Open to the Public:

Clarksburg Grocery (#4); Gardner/Miles House (#5); Clarksburg School (#6); Clarksburg Methodist Church (#14); and Dowden's Ordinary Marker (#20).

All other historic sites are closed to the public.

Good Morning, I am Eloise Woodfield born in Clarksburg Maryland and lived here for 65 years. I am seeing many changes in my hometown. It has changed my quality of life, but I am trying to adjust to the growth that is happening daily, this is not easy. However I would like to say that there was a Clarksburg before Clarksburg and I would like to see the Clarksburg Historical District, ole town, Preserved for the future.

Preserving and protecting the Irreplaceable is my goal and the goal of others that have called clarksburg home for many years.

Therefore I would ask that you consider our wishes and listen to what we have to say concerning Keeping the Horace Wilson House in its original location, where it has been for over 200 years and NOT move this historic home, that if its wall could talk would have a lot to tell where it was build on Old Frederick Rd, called the Great road in history.

Another issue of concern is a possible Road way that is not needed going beside the Horace Wilson House and the Historic old Clarksburg Grocery, known today as the clarksburg Grill. First I would like to point out that already there is ten roads in and out of the new town center, another road is not needed or necessary. If this new road is allowed from Clarksburg Square into 355 or old Frederick rd.,it would be a very busy road allowing traffic from not just Clarksburg ,but from other counties, making a commuter roadway thru the middle of our quaint old historic district. This would further more present a safety issue, for the children that attend the present day elementary school on Regrave Pl. I would like to suggest that

the Stringtown intersection be used for the way to enter the new town center, coming up 355 south turn left and just in a minute you can enter the grand entrance of the new town center commercial area, avoiding any of the residencial areas.

Another way to enter is from the intersection of 355 north and Clarksburg rd. also being a direct way to go straight into the commercial part of new town.

Other smaller roads also lead to this shopping area, making ten, so why would there be a need to create a busy highway in the core of Historic Clarksburg, the only place left that can be recognized as Clarksburg before Clarksburg.

I believe we can make the best of the best work and build a walkway between the Historical Home and the Grill today, thus making a Brick pedestrain friendly walk way connecting the old and the new. The Historic district of Clarksburg needs to stay as a quite part of the town ,providing a street that is free from commuter traffic where everyone can come to enjoy the experience of Clarksburg Past.

Thank you for letting me voice my concerns today and taking my suggestions to help settle the battles between the old and new on ideas for Clarksburg, Don't forget the people like myself and others and take away our heritage.

4. Horace Willson House

The original single-story three-bay rear section was built for Dr. John Reid c. 1800 who sold it to Thomas Anderson in 1813. Dr. Horace Willson purchased the lot and cabin valued at \$400 in 1821. Dr. Willson served in the State House of Delegates from 1831-1832 and in the State Senate from 1838-1841 as the only Montgomery County Representative. The one and a half story frame house with two dormers was built for Dr. Horace Willson in the 1840's. In 1843 the house was valued \$700. He had his office and medical library in this house which has three interior chimneys, and two gabled dormers. Mary E. L. Willson Neel purchased the house in 1852. After the death of her husband, Thomas Neel, Dr. William Augustus Waters was living here in 1865 and had an office here. Mary married Dr. Waters and they were living here in 1879. The house passed to her daughter Sarah Isabel Neel Sellman in the 1890's. Elwood and Edith Lillian Purdum Barr lived here before selling it in 1966. Henry J. and Jean C. Noyes purchased the house and have had various occupants here.
